


First World War Centenary

Welcome

2014 will mark 100 years since the start of the First World War. It is only fitting that Tameside has an appropriate programme of events and exhibitions which reflect the borough and its military heritage.

The programme is broad and hopefully will provide something for everyone from arts engagement projects including the Tameside Big Poppy Plant, to a 12 mile poppy walk and a range of exhibitions.

There are also opportunities for people to trace their military history in our local studies library or to meet serving personnel face to face as we celebrate Armed Forces Day and learn about the past at the ever popular Discovery Day in August.

There will also be a comprehensive commemoration package available to schools and community groups which will enable our young people to discover more about Tameside's heritage and gain a limited edition Arts Award qualification in the process. We are delighted to be extending our partnership working in this Centenary year with the National Theatre, Oldham Coliseum, Imperial War Museum, The Ministry of Defence and The Lowry to name just a few.

Our local links will also be key as we partner with the Royal British Legion on a variety of key projects and we further develop the work of the Armed Forces Community Covenant in Tameside.

We look forward to seeing many of you over the course of the programme.



Museum of the Manchester Regiment

The Museum tells the story of generations of Manchester Regiment soldiers through 200 years of service from 1756 until 1958. The museum tells their unique stories through the objects they left behind. There are thousands of objects on display in the museum; including uniforms, equipment and weaponry, to the souvenirs they collected and medals they won all over the world. The Museum of the Manchester Regiment is located within Ashton-under-Lyne's impressive Victorian Town Hall.



Portland Basin Museum

Portland Basin Museum is housed within the restored 19th century Ashton Canal Warehouse in Ashton-under-Lyne. The museum combines a lively modern interior with a peaceful canal side setting. It is an exciting family friendly museum, with something for all. Enjoy our temporary exhibition, and step back in time on our 1920s old street, as the sights and sounds of bygone Tameside are brought to life. Take a look into our kitchen and parlour to find out how we used to live. Visitors can explore the area's industrial heritage and discover what life was like down the mines, or on the farm. Find out more about local crafts and industries and marvel at our historic machines. Younger children will love our 'Nuts and Bolts' educational play area, suitable for children under 5.

General Military Resources

The local studies and archives centre has many resources to help you research First World War soldiers. We have free access to Ancestry and FindMyPast which contain many service records. If a soldier came from the Tameside area, you can use our collection of local newspapers to search for reports about their service and obituaries for fallen men. Manchester Regiment Archives

The Manchester Regiment Archive is one of the largest collections held on deposit at Tameside Local Studies and Archives Centre. A catalogue of all the records is available online at localstudies.tameside.gov.uk/calmview/. Please note that the archive does not contain a complete series of service records for soldiers and officers, nor does it contain a complete series of war diaries. Researchers are advised to use Ancestry.com to access service records, and to contact the National Archives for a complete set of war diaries, see www.nationalarchives.gov.uk/records/war-diaries-ww1.htm. The archive includes a large number of photographs, many of which can be accessed online at www.manchester-regiment.org.uk.

The First World War Centenary Partnership



1.5 Million Pages of Unit War Diaries Digitised

The National Archives has made thousands of digitised First World War unit war diaries from France and Flanders available online. They have digitised around 1.5 million pages so far, and will be releasing them throughout the year.

How do I get involved?

Tameside Big Poppy Plant

Cultural services are inviting schools, community groups and residents to join in Tameside's Big Poppy Plant, a project to commemorate the centenary of the start the First World War by growing poppies.

During March and April it is hoped that seeds will be sown in gardens, school grounds, community beds and waste ground in all corners of the borough to produce a striking and spectacular scarlet display by the time the 100th anniversary of Britain's entry into the conflict occurred on August 4. 
The commemorative seed packet was designed by Beth Weilding (age 10) as part of a borough-wide design competition. There is also a plan to create a digital legacy. People growing poppies are encouraged to e-mail images of their flowers in full bloom to events@tameside.gov.uk Images will be incorporated into the digital legacy and may be used for marketing and promotional purposes.

Tulip Sunday

On Sunday 27 April at Stamford Park the cultural services department will be visiting the annual Tulip Sunday event in partnership with the Royal British Legion and will be painting a corner of Stamford Park red with a pop-up poppy field. Come and join in making a variety of crafty poppies creating a striking display by the end of the event. Tulip Sunday is an event with lots of activities for the whole family to enjoy.

Poetry Competition

During centenary year the service will be accepting entries for the Centenary Poetry Competition. Entries should be the individuals own work and arrive at cultural services no later than November 30th there will be two categories under 16 and 16 and over. Entries will be used for marketing and project support purposes on the council website and on social media. The winners will be announced in mid December and will receive a £25 book token.



Do you have a centenary story to tell?

As part of our centenary programme we are hoping to record a series of radio shorts. These can be short narratives about a family heirloom, perhaps a First World War diary or a story of how the First World War affected someone you know and their or your own family. The 'shorts' will be broadcast and be used to support the centenary project in the borough.

Are you a Tameside Veteran?

Are you or do you know a Tameside veteran of any conflict? Then the cultural services team would like to hear from you. There are a number of exciting projects planned for the next few years which will provide a range of opportunities for veterans who were born in or reside in Tameside, including supported trips to Imperial War Museum North, The Museum of The Manchester Regiment, The National Theatre's production of War Horse and some projects with schools in the borough.

Armed Forces Day 2014

On Armed Forces Day, 30 June 2012, Tameside formally cemented its relationship with Britain's service personnel. Councillor Gerald P. Cooney, Executive Member for Learning and Achievement for Tameside and Lt. Col. Richard Jordan, commanding officer of 103rd Regiment, Royal Artillery, signed the Armed Forces Community Covenant on behalf of the council and residents.

Tameside Council has a long and historic relationship with the Armed Forces. The signing of the Armed Forces Community Covenant Pledge formalises this commitment and demonstrates that the council will take an active approach in developing services and improving access arrangements to local services.

Discovery Day

On August 6 2014, Tameside will be hosting a Discovery Day with a difference. Held annually this event centres around the fabulous collections held at the Museum of The Manchester Regiment.

For 2014 Tameside Cultural Services will be welcoming Regiment 103 of the Royal Artillery, 103 Regt. is a close knit and thriving regiment training on and deploying some of the Army's most advanced Artillery systems. They regularly exercise overseas as well as playing a full part in operations, with soldiers having served in Iraq, Afghanistan, Cyprus and the Balkans over recent years. However they do more than just military training with members enjoying a range of social, sporting and adventurous training opportunities.

The regiment based in the North West of England and are a force to be reckoned with. For this year only they will be coming to Tameside for Discovery Day for a challenge with a difference. Through a series of physical challenges the regiment will challenge senior council staff in aid of Tameside4Good.



Arts Award

One of the roles undertaken by cultural services is to champion cultural education in the borough which includes schools and a wide range of community settings. This includes the strategic development of Tameside's Arts Award programme, which is a nationally accredited qualification programme for culture and the arts. Most recently, Tameside has been identified as the leading local authority for ground breaking work in this area within the North West region.

By the end of spring the borough will have over 100 Arts Award advisors. Additionally all of the borough's cultural venues have joined the extensive network of Arts Award Supporter organisations and the service has been developing a wide range of bespoke materials to support pupils to learn about their cultural heritage. So far the programme has recently involved over a hundred children from Tameside visiting the highly acclaimed National Theatre production of War Horse, over four hundred children visiting the Private Peaceful production and an arts engagement project marking the Centenary "Denton Remembers".

Additionally the team have been developing the resource "A Local Hero" which is an Arts Award log enabling children and young people to find out more about their military heritage to gain their first step on the Arts Award journey with a limited edition Centenary certificate. 
